Happy New Year to all our supporters. Today was our first session back after the Christmas/New Year break, with 94 people representing 57 families/couples and 37 single people attending despite the bitter weather (140 adults and 93 children).

Donations were received from several local churches, primary schools, Food Waste Champions and individual supporters. The Fareshare allocation included tomatoes, potatoes and carrots enabling all members to receive a full bag of fresh fruit and vegetables in addition to dried and tinned items and bread.

The volunteers worked tirelessly, with all of them being called on during the session for translation assistance. Today the various volunteers spoke Albanian, Turkish, Arabic, French, Farsi, Tigrinya and English. Without them we would not be able to engage so successfully with our local community.

On January 20th from 2.00 - 3.30 there will be an Open Afternoon for volunteers and supporters of the Food Co-op. You are most welcome to join us for refreshments and to meet the volunteers.
